Council agenda (voting) meetings are held on the second and fourth Wednesdays. Anyone wishing to speak at a meeting should sign up with the City Secretary's Office by calling (214) 670-3738 by 5:00 p.m. of the last regular business day preceding the meeting. Citizens can find out the name of their representative and their voting district by calling the City Secretary's Office.

Sign interpreters are available upon request with a 48-hour advance notice by calling (214) 670-5208 V/TDD. The City of Dallas is committed to compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Council agenda is available in alternative formats upon request.

Rules of Courtesy

City Council meetings bring together citizens of many varied interests and ideas. To insure fairness and orderly meetings, the Council has adopted rules of courtesy which apply to all members of the Council, administrative staff, news media, citizens and visitors. These procedures provide:

- That no one shall delay or interrupt the proceedings, or refuse to obey the orders of the presiding officer.
- All persons should refrain from private conversation, eating, drinking and smoking while in the Council Chamber.
- Posters or placards must remain outside the Council Chamber.
- No cellular phones or audible beepers allowed in Council Chamber while City Council is in session.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to Section 2254.1036 of the Texas Government Code, as amended, the City of Dallas, Texas (the "City") hereby gives public notice of its intent to enter into a contingent fee contract for legal services at its duly called meeting to be held on April 12, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers of the City Hall, 6th Floor, 1500 Marilla Street, Dallas, Texas.

- The City Council previously entered into a contingency fee contract (the "Contract")
 for disclosure counsel legal services with Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP and
 Kintop Smith, PLLC ("Prior Co-Counsel"); however, the Prior Co-Counsel has
 discontinued its status as a legal entity and is no longer able to represent the City.
- 2. The City Council intends to supplement the Contract to replace the Prior Co-Counsel with the Hardwick Law Firm, LLC to provide the City with co-disclosure counsel legal services pertaining to the City's issuance of securities on the public or private market.
- 3. Accessing the public or private markets through the issuance of securities and providing an offering document of the City to potential investors is governed by State and federal securities laws and federal tax laws and requires the advice of legal advisors that specialize in public finance matters and that are well versed in public finance legal matters.
- 4. Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP and Hardwick Law Firm, LLC ("Co-Counsel") have demonstrated to the City their competence, qualifications, and experience as industry leaders in public finance matters.
- 5. The City does not currently employ attorneys and/or supporting personnel qualified to provide disclosure counsel legal services.
- 6. Engaging attorneys in private practice who specializes in public finance matters and are well versed in State and federal securities and federal tax laws pursuant to an hourly fee arrangement would likely result in higher fees to be paid by the City, and such fees incurred would be payable by the City from the City's general revenues, whether or not the securities are issued.
- 7. Fees for legal services in public finance matters, including disclosure counsel legal services, have traditionally been paid pursuant to a contingent fee arrangement, where such fees become payable only upon the successful issuance of City securities.
- 8. Supplementing the Contract to engage Co-Counsel provides the City with a superior level of disclosure counsel legal services, allows the City to address legal issues associated with its financings without immediately incurring additional legal fees, and fees payable under the Contract are reasonable in the public finance market.
- 9. For each of the reasons stated above, the execution of a supplemental agreement with Co-Counsel is in the best interest of the residents of the City.
